


Islam is the fastest growing religion in America.


But what do we know about this religion? What is their history? What do they believe?

Some know that **Kareem Abdul-**Jabbar (NBA superstar) was born as Lew Alcindor, but converted from **Catholic to Islam before the 1971-72** season.





The only thing some people know about **Islam is that Cassius Clay changed his** name to Muhammad Ali in 1975, after he converted to Sunni Islam.



Some remember the **April 1983 bombing** of the U.S. embassy in Beirut, Lebanon, by the Islamic Jihad **Organization**, leaving 63 dead and 120 injured.





Some remember the 1992 attack on the Israeli Embassy in Buenos Aires, leaving 29 dead and 242 injured.



Some remember the November 17, 1997, Luxor massacre, when 6 armed Islamic terrorists attacked tourists at the Luxor ruins, killing 62 and injuring 26.



Some remember the August 7, 1998, bombing of the U.S. Embassy in Tanzania and Kenya, leave 224 dead and 4000+ injured.



Some remember the October 12, 2000, attack on USS Cole in the Yemeni port of Aden, leaving 17 American sailors dead and 39 injured.





Some remember the **Christmas** Eve attack in Indonesia in 2000, bombing churches in 8 cities and killing 18 people.



And who can forget September 11, 2001, when 4 planes were hijacked by 19 al-Qaeda members: two planes crashed into the World Trade **Center in New York, one into** The Pentagon in Virginia, and one into a field in Pennsylvania, leaving 2,977 dead.





And the list goes on and on, from the **Boston Marathon** bombing right down to the recent shooting in Chattanooga, **Tennessee**, leaving 5 **American service** men dead.



So what do we really know about this religion? Why does there seem to be so much violence connected with Islam? What does our future hold for us?

These lectures are designed to study Islam, to know where they came from, what they believe, and what their goals are.

Let's begin with just some terminology. We've got to make sure we know what is meant by certain words.

"Islam" – Arabic word for "submission" (to the will of Allah)

Islam is used to refer to the religion.

Terminology

Mohammedism or Muhammadanism - The name formerly common in Western usage for the religion, but not used among Muslims.





Islam – Muslims believe that the origin of Islam dates back to the creation of the world.



Islam – Islam claims to be the religion of all the prophets (Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses, Jesus, and Mohammad).



Muslim – A follower of Islam. It literally means one who "surrenders" or "submits" to the will of Allah. According to the Qur'an, all of those who submit to one God are Muslims.

Terminology



Muhammad - The prophet and founder of Islam. Born around 570 A.D. and died 632 A.D. Mohammad – Second spelling



Qur'an (Romanized to be Koran) -The inspired word of God given to Muhammad by the angel Gabriel.





Deen - The Qur'an describes Islam as an Arabic word Deen (way of life). Some will even argue that Islam is *not* a religion.





Surah - What the chapters of the Qur'an are called, 114 in all. Ayat – What the verses are called, 6,236 in all.



Allah - The Supreme Being. The name of God.





Hadith - The sacred sayings of Muhammad, handed down by oral tradition and finally written down.





Mecca or Makkah - The birthplace of Muhammad and the holy city o Islam.





Medina (muh-dee-nah) – Holy city named for Muhammad after he fled there in 622 A.D.



Hijrah (hige-ruh) -Muhammad's flight from Mecca to Medina in 622 A.D.





Hajj - The pilgrimage to Mecca, one of the five pillars of the Islamic faith.





Mosque - Islamic place of worship.





Muezzlin – Muslim caller who announces the hour of prayer.

Terminology

Salat (suh-lot) – Muslims daily prayer ritual. One of the five pillars of Islam.

Terminology

Salat (suh-lot) – The prayers are observed five times every day at these times: Fajr: Shortly before sunrise. Dhuhr: At noon. 'Asr: In the late afternoon. *Maghrib*: Just after the sun goes down. 'Isha: Before retiring for the night.

Salat (suh-lot) – The worshiper uses different postures: He starts standing, bows, prostrates himself, and concludes while on the ground. **During each posture, the worshiper recites or** reads certain verses, phrases and prayers.




Salat (suh-lot) — The following prayer is recited at least 17 time a day: "All praise is due to Allah, Lord of the worlds, The Most Gracious, the Most Merciful, and Sovereign of the Day of Judgment. It is You alone we worship and You alone we ask for help. Guide us to the straight path; The path of those upon whom You have bestowed favor, not of those who have evoked Your anger or of those who are astray" (1:1-7)





Peace Be Upon Him – An expression used by Muslims to show respect to all prophets of Allah. Muslims usually say it just after pronouncing the name of Prophets.



Ramadan (ram-uh-dahn) – The ninth and most sacred month of the Islamic year, believing it to be the month in which the Qur'an was revealed to Muhammad. It is considered a month of fasting.

Shi'ites – The Muslim sect which insists that Muhammad's son-in-law 'Ali was Muhammad's rightful successor.



Sunnites – The largest Muslim sect which acknowledges all of Muhammad's successors.



•Although the Arabs believed in the unity of God, but they also claimed that God has entrusted His duties to various gods, goddesses and idols. For this purpose, they had more than 360 idols.

They considered angels as the daughters of God.

- They were ignorant of social values.
- They were nomadic people who were dependent on cattle for their living.
 There was no government or law. All power existed with the rich.



The society was full of barbarity and brutality. Tribes fought with each other over trivial matters for centuries. A slight argument over horses or water could lead to the slaughtering of thousands of innocent people. It was the birth of Mohammad which brought a revolution to the entire fate of the nomadic Arabs.



Mohammad was born in 570 A.D in the city of Makkah. The name Mohammad itself means "Highly Praised".
His father, Abdullah, died before his birth and his mother, Amina, died when he was only six.
Mohammad's parental grandfather

Mohammad's parental grandfather, Abdul Al Muttalib, the most respected leader of Makkah, took care of him until he died when Mohammad was eight.

The Qur'an says that God, the **Almighty, reminds Mohammed of** his blessing: "Did God not find you an orphan and give you shelter and care? And he found you wandering, and gave you guidance. And he found you in need, and made you independent." (93:6-8)



- At the age of twelve, Mohammad started working as a trader. Soon he became very famous because of his loyalty and reliability.
- •When he was twenty-five, Khadijah, a forty-year-old rich merchant widow proposed to him. He accepted the proposal after considering the advice of his uncle.





Mohammad disliked the worshipping of idols. He was influenced by the Hanefites, a group of people who rejected idol worshipping. He spent much of his time at Mt. Hera praying to God.

At the age of 40 (610 A.D), when meditating at Mt. Hera, the angel Gabriel appeared and revealed to him the message of God. Gabriel said to him, "Iqra" which means "to read." Mohammad replied "I cannot read." Gabriel embraced and released him. Then the first five verses was revealed to him.



- •As Prophet Mohammad started proclaiming the concept of believing in one God, the people started getting against him.
- The people who once called him "Trustworthy" and "Honest" boycotted and plotted to kill him.



After the death of of his wife, Khadijah, and his uncle, Abu Talib, in 619 A.D, the people of Makkah plotted to kill Mohammad on various occasions. He sought refuge in Medina to protect his life.

During the next few years, a series of battles were fought between various tribes of Makkah and the Muslims of Medina. In 628 A.D, the Treaty of Hudaibiyah was signed between the two parties. Truce was declared for 10 years.




• Mohammad died in 632 A.D, at the age of 63 in the city of Medina. Mohammad's death brought a huge catastrophe among Muslims. People could not believe that Mohammad had left them forever. Many of the followers were perplexed and distraught, and claimed him to be still living.



respected of all the followers affirmed that, "O people, those of you who worshipped Mohammad, Mohammad has died. And those of you who worshipped God, God is still living."



- Abu Bakr [*uh*-boo-beck-er] was chosen as the first *Caliph* (leader). Before his death in 634 A.D., Umar ibn ul Khattab was appointed as his successor.
- During the ten years of his rule, Muslims conquered 22 hundred thousands miles of area, including Mesopotamia, parts of Persia, Iran, Egypt, Palestine, Syria, North Africa and Armenia.



Islam's symbol is the crescent moon.

It depicts the moon in a state of increaserepresenting the growth of Islamic faith from small to great.





By the tenth century, Islam dominated the half of the world known at that time.

So where do we differ? How does the Bible and the Quar'an differ? What was different in the teachings of Jesus and Mohammad?

I simply ask all students to study with open mind to find and obey God's final prophet:

- What are the identification marks in prophecy?
- Is the Savior-Prophet identified?
- Did God prophecy Mohammed to be another prophet?
- Was Jesus Christ the final prophet from God?

- Look at the identification marks in prophecy:
- Genesis 3:15 says the seed of woman would defeat Satan

And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.

In Genesis 12:1-3, God made three promises to Abraham.

¹Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee: ² And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing: ³ And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

Human Plan: Ishmael (Genesis 16) Divine Plan: Isaac (Genesis 21:1-21)

The Qur'an says Ishmael:

- "Raised the Foundations" of God's House (2:128)
- "Purified" God's House of Devotion & Prayer (2:126)
- Was One of the Patriarchs (2:137; 3:85; 14:40)
- Was "Exalted with Elisha, Jonah and Lot" (6:87)
- Was a "Messenger & Prophet" (19:55)

The Bible says of Ishmael:

"The angel of the LORD also said to [Hagar]: "You are now with child and you will have a son. You shall name him Ishmael, for the LORD has heard of your misery. ¹²He will be a wild donkey of a man; his hand will be against everyone and everyone's hand against him, and he will live in hostility toward all his brothers" (Gen. 16:11-12).

In Deuteronomy 18:18-19, God said He would raise up a prophet like Moses.

¹⁸I will raise them up a Prophet from among their brethren, like unto thee, and will put my words in his mouth; and he shall speak unto them all that I shall command them.

¹⁹ And it shall come to pass that whosoever will Not hearken unto my words which he shall speak in my name, I will require it of him.

Isaiah 7:14 said He was to be born of a virgin.

Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

Matthew 1:18-25 shows that it happened.

¹⁸Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Ghost. ²⁰...behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying,... ²¹And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.

Matthew 1:18-25 shows that it happened.

²²Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying,
²³Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.

 Micah 5:2 said He was to be born in Bethlehem.

But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting.


Isaiah 53:4-5 said He was to die for our sins.

- La ilaha illa Allah, Muhammadu Rasool Allah -- "There is no God but Allah, Muhammad is His Prophet" - The essential Muslim profession of faith.

What Is The Ultimate Goal of Islam?

"Surely the true religion with ALLAH is Islam..."

"And whoso seeks a religion other than Islam, it shall not be accepted of him, and in the Hereafter he shall be among the losers"

"And fight them until there is no persecution, and religion is professed only for ALLAH..."
